Svetlana (college teacher buying and distributing the items) also asked if candy could be bought for the children and I approved the expense which was given out just before Christmas.

I received many photos of the items and recipients which I have included in this article.

Dec. 23, 2022 Svetlana wrote:

"I send you greetings from all the children and parents of our class. Many people asked me to thank



you and say that it is very good that Ukraine has such a good friend as America. Also, there are people living in America who don't care how hard it is to live in Ukraine now, especially for those regions that are closer to the Russian border.

The children congratulated you on Christmas and wished you health, peace, and family comfort.

The lights were very useful. We just have problems with the light. Turn off 2 hours after 2 hours. At this time there is no internet, most shops are closed. There are no

streetlights on the street. I can purchase and distribute goods only on weekends. More shops may be open on these days.

I bought candy for the children, tomorrow, on the eve of Christmas. We will distribute it to the students in the class where my son studies.

My son says that the gift he would like to receive for the holidays is light, so that it would be there, that the Christmas tree would glow, that you could watch TV,

that there would be an (reliable) Internet connection. Ukrainians now have other values: light, water, heat, so that there would be peace, there would be no air alarms, no threat of an air strike, so that the whole family would be together, and everyone would be healthy.

WATCH OUT FOR THE BLIND-SIDED

Often times I write my Safety Articles based on an incident that may have recently occurred where I see there is a valuable safety issue to discuss. Such is the subject of this month's Safety Article.

On Thursday, December 1st, at approximately 11:00 am, an on duty Tampa Police Motor Officer was East-bound on Adamo Dr. approaching 26th St. A woman driving a 4dr Honda Accord turned left in front of him. His motorcycle struck the right front and side of her vehicle. The Officer went to the hospital with some broken bones but not life threatening injuries, thank God.

When the woman was interviewed she stated that she didn't see the motorcycle. She stated traffic was backed up and she was waved through a gap in the cars by one of the car drivers. This type of scenario often happens in backed up traffic where a driver is just trying to be helpful and let you proceed through the stopped cars. This is also one of the most dangerous situations you can put yourself in. You don't know if the waving driver is telling you they are letting you through the opening but you must still see if the way is clear, or are they telling you they are letting you through the opening and the way is clear to proceed. As in the case with this crash, the women driver involved in the crash assumed the waving driver was telling her the way was clear. Obviously it was not. If you choose to take advantage of the polite driver waving you through, always stop first in the opening and look to see if the way is really clear.

When you are riding your motorcycle in heavy stopped traffic, always look for possible openings in stopped traffic where a vehicle might suddenly appear cutting through. Your path of travel must be fluid. If you see a gap in traffic, you should go wide in your lane away from the opening. If you are on a multi-lane roadway, you should change lanes away from the opening. You can also stay next to another larger vehicle going in the same direction on a multi-lane road as you pass the opening. The driver cutting through might not see you but hopes are they would see the larger vehicle you are driving next to and not pull out in front of both of you.




