










KOA", about 45 minutes from Knoxville, Pigeon Forge, and Gatlinburg. The location was perfect. Nothing like camping in the Great Smokies!

Greetings to all! The first annual Eagle Wings Motorcycle Association Rendezvous is in the history books now.

With much regret we missed the event. Hurricane Idalia had other plans for us here in Tampa. We live next to the bay and there was a predicted 12-14ft storm surge possibility. Our house is only 9 ft above sea level so we had no choice but to stay home and hope for the best. We experienced no damage from the storm.

There are many events coming up for us and anyone else that was affected by Idalia. We will be attending the upcoming rallies in North Carolina, Alabama, and Mississippi. Hope to see you there.

IDLE THREAT

Sitting idle waiting for the traffic light to change green may be revving up your risk of being struck from behind. The legendary Hurt Report (1981) covered motorcycle accident cause factors and identified if any countermeasures could have been used by the motorcyclist to avoid the accidents. The report listed by category the type of accidents the motorcycles were involved in along with the percentage of each separate category. Rear end accidents only accounted for about 3% of all accidents where motorcyclists were struck from behind. A recent study conducted of Florida crashes showed motorcyclists are now being struck from the rear 29% of the time. The Hurt Report also showed that 80% of the time the motorcyclists did not do anything to avoid the accidents.

What has changed? Motorcycle and car technology has gotten better hasn't it? Mechanical technology has gotten better but people have gotten worse. What has gotten worse is cell phone use including texting. The new-normal drivers simply aren't paying enough attention. They aren't recognizing traffic slowing ahead until it's too late. Bad news for you on your motorcycle when you are the next vehicle in front of the distracted driver. In addition to increasing your conspicuity with hi-viz clothing and products like brake light flashers, here are some recommendations on how to deal with distracted drivers.

Slow gradually. When you anticipate a changing traffic light or see a stop sign ahead, take your time getting to the stop. Slow gradually instead of carrying speed right up to the intersection. You'll have a better chance of getting that distracted driver to slow down with you rather than relying on them to suddenly react to you. That way you will spend less time actually stopped and vulnerable to being hit. When you are actually stopping position your motorcycle either offset left (preferably) or offset right of the car in front of you, far enough back so you could use either side of the car in front of you as an escape path should the car behind you fail to stop. Once you come to a standstill maintain a "tactical ready position", keeping your bike in first gear, your hands on the controls and an eye on the mirror. Keep an eye on the car behind you that it isn't creeping forward because the driver is looking down on the phone. When the light turns green, check the mirror to make sure that the car behind doesn't begin to move forward before the traffic in front of you and you have begun to move.

We are not going to be able to get the car drivers off of their cell phones. The only thing we can do is to be aware that this potential danger is real to us, the motorcyclists, and take proper counter measures to deal with this danger.


